April Meeting Show N' Tell

New member Lynn Langer brought a Hobby Hanger 1/5 scale Bf 109E-4 kit. The model is painted as Col. Adolf Galland's JG26 aircraft that he flew in the Battle of Britain in 1940. Model has an 82" one piece foam wing and currently has an OS BGX installed for power. Lynn says he is slowly restoring the model to modern standards (kit was built in late 90's for Toledo Convention competition).



Lynn plans to upgrade the motor to a small gas



engine with all modern servos and radio gear. Reportedly this is the last surviving example of this model kit (only a few were manufactured, fewer were built).

This plane is highly detailed including the cockpit as seen in the photo. However, it will be a while until this model is completely ready to fly. ...*(Continued on page 3)*

Bob Burt displayed one half of the huge wing for his current large scale airplane project. According to Bob, the Aeronca 7AC Champ is being built from RCM plans. It is a one-third scale model with a 141 inch wingspan weighing about 35 lbs. He will power it



with a Quadra 54 gasser. Bob says he is trying to build everything himself.

Further, he didn't plan to build the cowl and wind screen due



to RCM being completely defunct. Bob cannot get the Aeronca project articles from RCM now. So he will have to build the molds and make the fiberglass parts himself. Covering on the Aeronca will be Coverite, and Nelson paints will be used. Great project Bob! The next Show 'N Tell (...and fly) will be at the Springfield site where the May meeting is scheduled.

On 23 April 2007 conditions were ideal for Dean Copeland's 1/6th scale Northrop N9M flying wing's maiden flight. It was performed at the Wahoo Airport with winds at or under 8 mph.

Dean eased the wing off the runway at 200 ft and into a gentle climb out. It



flew around the airport for approximately 6 thrilling minutes before landing back on the taxiway. Dean was extremely satisfied with the flight which is in preparation for the Top Gun competition in a few weeks. He has a top contender with the Wing, and should do very well at the competition for his category of scratch built scale aircraft. Wish him good luck.
